You Love Organizing & Planning



1 **Digital planners**

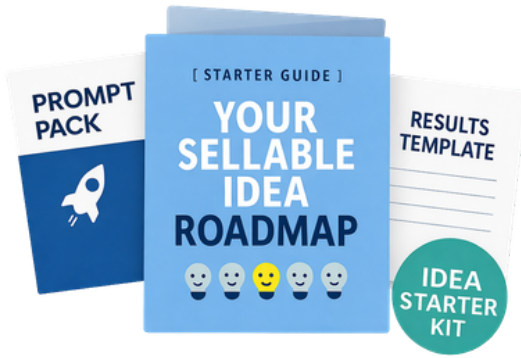
